


























China


England

"It's ALWAYS tEA time"




Argentina

India


TEA: MASALA CHAI

"Masala" means a mix of spices

TEA: MATCHA

- Chanoyu tea ceremony
 - 800 years old
 - takes place in a bamboo teahouse
 - a tea master will invite you to sit on the floor

Tea Manners: tea will be served with the front of the cup facing you. Rotate the cup to have the back facing you as a show of respect.

TEA: TOUAREG (MINT)

 Tea is a symbol of Moroccan hospitality - the friendly and generous reception and entertainment of guests, visitors, or strangers.

Tea Manners: It would be considered an insult for you to refuse tea.
